


As you will be aware we continue to gather information at various time points during your involvement with the trial. These time points occur at 6, 12, 24, 36, 48 and 60 months after randomisation. Many of you will be approaching your 36 month follow up visit, this consists of a face to face clinic visit and unfortunately cannot be completed over the telephone. If it is more convenient, why not kill two birds with one stone and arrange

to have your 36 month follow up whilst at your routine mammogram visit. If this option is suitable to you then please contact your research nurse to make this appointment sooner rather than later.

A message from the quality of life team at SHORE-C A BIG THANK YOU for

completing the Quality of Life questionnaires. These are an invaluable part of the study and will help doctors understand how breast cancer treatments affect patients' everyday lives long term. The data we collect will help them to discuss treatment options more fully with newly diagnosed patients in the future. The questionnaires we use have been designed to capture information from a wide range of people suffering with different symptoms. This means that you might consider some of the questions don't apply to you. If this is the case, we recommend that you choose the 'not at all' option to avoid problems with missing answers.
